INTRODUCTION-

Varunadi kwath is an Ayurvedic liquid (herbal) medicine used in treatment of various Renal Disorders like Renal Calculi, Urinary tract infection, Urinary tract inflammations causing symptoms like burning micturition, pain in abdomen, dark coloured urine etc

The contents of Varunadi kwath are as follows:

Method of Preparation -

- Kashaya (Decoction) is made up of coarse powder of first three herbs in given proportion added with water, then boiled over low fire in order to reduce to its specified quantity (1/4th of Water). Then filtered and kept.
- Yavakshara (500mg) is added as 'Prakshepa dravya' to it and mixed till gets dissolved

Uses -

Of Varunadi Kwath

- The ingredients of Varunadi Kwath possess properties like Chedana, Bhedana, Lekhana, Tridoshghna, Mutrala, Mutrakrucchrahara, Anulomana, and Krimighna which helps significantly in Mutrashmari treatment.
- The ingredients of this formulation pacify Kapha Dosha by virtue of their Ruksha Guna, Katu Vipaka and Ushna Virya.
- The Vatanulomana, Shothahara and Mutrala properties help to relieve Pain and Shotha, related to Urinary system.
- Thus, in short this formulation has the capacity to disintegrate the pathogenesis of the disease 'Ashmari'.

Of Varuna-

- It has Urinary Antiseptic, Anti-inflammatory and Diuretic properties.
- It is Kaphahara and shows Lekhana property due to Ushna Virya.
- Lupeol, a chemical constituent of Crataeva Nurvala (Varuna) has shown Antiurolithiatic activity.

Of Gokshura

- It has Anti-Inflammatory, Antimicrobial, Diuretic, Antispasmodic, Litholytic and Anticalcifying properties
- It contains Potassium nitrite in rich quantity which acts as a 'Urine alkalizer'.

It posseses Madhura Vipak and Ushna Virya, which helps in Vata Dosha shamana whereas Deepana helps for Amapachana.

Of Yavakshara

- Yavakshara is 'Alkaline' in nature (having pH 11.73), thus it helps to neutralize the acidic media and prevent Calculus formation as well as changes in pH of urine, this helps in preventing the Hyperconcentration of the urine.
- Ultimately qualities like Ruksha, Laghu, Teekshna, Shighragami it reduces the growth of the calculus by inhibiting the binding property of Kapha Dosha.

Dosage-

15 to 30 ml, twice a day for 2 to 3 weeks

Varunadi kwath usually does not develop any side effect when used according to Doshadushti and in recommended dosage.
